POOL NEWS

By the time you read this, you may have finally been able to cool off at the Recreation Center Pool for the first time this year. As you can imagine, with all the concerns about the novel coronavirus, there were a number of concerns to address before we could open the pool, not the least of which were the everchanging guidelines coming from the State of Virginia, the CDC, and other authorities. Now that the Governor has loosened the restrictions a bit, and we've all gotten a better understanding of how to best manage this new normal, we believe we've found a workable solution that allows us to safely offer some cool, liquid respite to the dog-days of summer. Now, we know access to the pool is tight this year due to the limited numbers of residents allowed at a given time. We also know many residents simply choose to stay away from groups of people and not to partake of the pool not matter the level of access. So, the Board of Directors passed a temporary resolution allowing above ground pools in Kiln Creek for the summer season (see page 9). PEDESTRIAN PATH UPDATE

With so many people utilizing the Pedestrian Paths, we're happy to be able to continue to make progress on their renovation this season. The project will take many weeks to complete, but the end result will be worth the inconvenience. Once all the work is completed, we can reassess the conditions and begin to add back a few trees to replace the handful whose roots had damaged the paths and had to be removed. We're happy to be able to report the cost of the project is much less than was anticipated, and the final product should be much improved for years to come. ABOVE GROUND POOLS **TEMPORARILY ALLOWED**

We understand that some residents may not wish to visit the pool this year for safety reasons, therefore the Board of Directors has also approved a temporary variance for above ground pools in fenced backyards until September 30, 2020.

The general idea is to allow those of you with children (and those of you who may still be a child at heart!) to get some relaxation, cooling, and recreational relief not currently allowed under the limited uses of the Rec Center pool. There are a number of obligations and restrictions of which to take note, and all pools must be removed immediately at the end of the season.

PLEASE NOTE THE BASIC REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SPECIAL ALLOWANCE:

- One above-ground swimming pool may be placed in the backyard only of a residential Lot;
- A fence is required for any pools that will not be drained after each use;
- The Lot Owner/resident must comply with all ordinances of York County (for Lots located in York County) and the City of Newport News (for Lots located in the City of Newport News), including but not limited to any fencing requirements;
- If a fence is to be constructed, a prior application for the fence must be submitted to the Association's Architectural Review Board ("ARB") and approved by the ARB, and the fence must conform to the ARB's specifications and requirements for fences in the Villages of Kiln Creek;
- The above-ground pool must be fully and completely removed from the Lot on or before September 30, 2020;
- Owners shall be responsible for re-seeding during the fall of 2020, any portions of their lawn that have been damaged as a result of the pool.
- Pool shall be installed at least 5 feet from the property line/fence."

We strive to keep on track with the 2020 Community Reviews. In our efforts to keep our community up to the Kiln Creek Standards, we have given longer time frames to complete the items on your reviews. Many of our residents have used this time complete work needed around the house themselves. We also understand some residents have been affected economically due to the many closings and need longer time frames to complete the work and we are more than happy to give extensions. If you receive a letter but will need an extension, or have already planned work to be done, simply call or email me at sherrill@kilncreek.org. The reviews are mainly done from our work vehicles and common areas. We look at your house from different angles, from down the street and even from surrounding streets. Sometimes we need to go on foot, or on a gator to see certain items, or to go around a lake or the golf course to see. So be aware when checking your house for roof stains, chimney caps etc., you may need to check all sides of your home to see what we see. If you can't find it, we are happy to send you a picture if you need us to show you exactly what we saw, just give us a call and we can go back out. We would also like to remind you that we do not go onto anyone's property when conducting the community reviews, unless there are extenuating circumstances or an owner requests us to.

We have completed ¾ of our 2020 Reviews at this point. We went a little out of order while working from home, so there are only a few neighborhoods left. All reviews will be completed by the end of July.

EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS


STAY SAFE



Disasters can happen at any time, and hurricane season is now in full swing. Please read the following information from ReadyVirginia.gov and vaemergency.gov to prepare yourself and your loved ones.

Talk to your family about the hazards that could affect your area and what you should do if it happens.

- Decide on a place to meet one in your neighborhood and one outside your neighborhood in case you cannot return to your home.
- Write down your plan and make it part of your emergency supply kit. Download the worksheets below and fill them out. Have each member of your household carry a wallet card with them.
- Texts, email and social media posts are more likely to get through when cell networks are overloaded.
- Plan for your pets. Most evacuation shelters allow service animals only. (See more about pets below.)
- Ask an out-of-town friend or family member to serve as a point of contact for all the member of your household. Often during an emergency, long-distance calls will go through when local networks are overwhelmed.
- If you are instructed to turn off your home's utilities, teach family members where and how to turn them off. Keep tools near the location. If you turn off the gas, a professional must turn it back on do not attempt to do it yourself.



Since Hurricane season is in full swing, we just wanted to remind you of the Newport News and York County Regulations for bulk trash pick-up.

Newport News Storm Debris: Newport News's bulk trash collection will pick up storm debris less than 6 inches in diameter. Pick up dates are: July 13 & 27, August 10 & 24, September 8 & 21.

Yorktown Storm Debris: Please note that Yorktown does not have a regularly scheduled bulk trash pick-up. All storm debris must either be: a) placed into your regular trash bin if it can fit, b) taken to the Y.C. Dump, or c) called into Y.C. solid waste to schedule a pick-up at 809-3780.

**Please also note that if you have had a tree come down, you still need to submit a notice in writing to the HOA office so we have documentation in your file that the tree has come down. Please note any trees that have fallen must be cut to ground level, or ground out.





14 PET SAFETY TIPS FOR A HURRICANE

As the old saying goes, "an ounce of prevention beats a pound of cure."

This is especially true when dealing with an impending hurricane. A 2018 survey conducted by Banfield revealed that 91% of pet owners are not prepared for the next natural disaster. Following some simple hurricane safety tips can help assure that you and your pets have everything you need in the event of a hurricane.

- 1. Make a Hurricane Safety Plan Simply put, be prepared. Decide on a course of action and make sure you can initiate it at a moment's notice. Have hurricane safety supplies set aside in a safe, easily accessible place.
- 2. Stick to Your Emergency Plan- Whatever your decision is, stick to it. Otherwise, you may put your pet in real danger.
- 3. Have a Pet Emergency Kit Ready Your pet emergency kit should include:
 - At least enough water for a week for you and your pets
 - Nonperishable food (include a can opener if needed)
 - Food dishes and water bowls
 - Your pet's medical records/proof of vaccination
 - Prescription medications (two-week supply)
 - ID tags on your pets' collars or harnesses
 - Cat litter and litter box

- Photos of your pets
- Pet first aid kit
- Comfort items: pet bed, toys, treats
- Extra leash
- Solid pet carrier
- Puppy pads
- Plastic bags or poop bags
- 4. Microchip Your Pets Pet ID tags are definitely a smart idea for providing quick identification without having to scan for a

microchip. But the ASPCA also recommends microchipping your pet as a more permanent form of identification, should collars or tags become lost.

- 5. Fill Out a Pet Emergency Sticker for Your Front Door It's a good idea to place a pet emergency sticker outside the doors in your home and to keep a card in your wallet both filled out with your contact information and your pets' info. Include the number and type of pets along with their coat color and names. In the event that you need to be rescued, this will help to alert local rescue personnel to which animals may also be trapped in the home.
- 6. Choose a Designated Caregiver If something happens and you are unable to care for your pets, you need to have a plan in place to make sure they are cared for.
- 7. Download the Free FEMA App One app to download is the FEMA app, which provides emergency safety tips, a shelter locator and alerts from the National Weather Service.
- 8. Order and Give Your Pet Their Heartworm Prevention Always keep up with your pet's prescription heartworm medication. It is especially important in the aftermath of a hurricane because there is usually quite a bit of flooding, which is ideal for mosquito colonies.
- 9. Make Sure Your Pet Is Current on Vaccinations Since more wild animals will be out and in places they normally wouldn't be due to the storm, get your pet up to date on all vaccinations. Your pet can also encounter bacteria in puddles and flood waters. Rabies, distemper and leptospirosis are some of the most concerning viruses in these situations.
- 10. Don't Ignore Evacuation Warnings Stay tuned to the news. If you're told to evacuate, you must do so at first warning.
- 11. Know Where Pet-Friendly Shelters Are Located Make sure you know ahead of time exactly where the pet-friendly emergency shelters are and how to get to them.
- 12. Keep Your Pets Safe When Evacuating When evacuating with your pet, the most important thing you can do is ensure they are safely secured in a pet carrier and that you have handling equipment, including a collar and leash. This will help prevent your pet from escaping and getting lost. If you are evacuating with your pets, bring your disaster kit with you. Make sure to bring copies of your pet's medical and vaccination records with you, as many evacuation shelters will not accept your pet without proof that they are properly vaccinated.
- 13. Prepare for Possible Injuries If your pet becomes injured during a hurricane or evacuation, remain calm. You should first make sure that you and your pet are out of harm's way. Assess your pet's situation—is it something you can take care of with your first aid kit? Or is it a serious injury?
- 14. Stay Calm Whether you leave early, choose to stay or are required to evacuate due to the storm's severity, remember to stay calm. Your pet can sense your emotions, so maintaining a calm demeanor can lead to a less-panicked pet.
